### Day One: Thrillers

- a) Digger's Dungeon (Poplar Branch)
- b) Harley Davidson (Powells Point)

Visit the home of the well known **Grave Digger Monster Truck** and check out a monster truck up close, purchase digger gear, or take a ride on the back of Monster Truck. If you are looking for thrilling ride while on your vacation, head to **Harley Davidson** and rent a couple of motor cycles on your way to the Outer Banks. #### Day Two: Golf

Golf, for the most part, ranked as a secondary attraction to the other main draws. That perception, however, is gradually changing. As assuredly as sands shift on the OBX, golf is making a move up the beachgoer's priority list. The **Kilmarlic Golf Club** is the infant on the Outer Banks golf scene. This most recent addition, designed by Tom Steele, is a Scottish seaside links layout that opened in 2002. The Kilmarlic Club quickly garnered enough positive notoriety in its brief history to be named host of the 2004 North Carolina Open. **The Pointe Golf Club** is located just south of the Kilmarlic Club on the opposite side of Hwy. 158. The word among the locals is that this Russell Breeden-designed course is considered the most playable course in the Outer Banks area. Opened in 1995, it was the first course in the vicinity to offer A-1 bent-grass greens. If you are planning on staying around Corolla, the **Currituck Club** at the far northern end of the Outer Banks is arguably the premier course in the area. It has won its fair share of "best of" accolades since opening in 1996. Golfers needing a beacon of hope on the back nine can catch an inspiring glimpse of the Currituck Lighthouse from the elevated tee of No.13, a 578-yard par 5.

After a round of golf, enjoy a nice cold brew at the **Wheeping Radish Brewery** or **Corolla Brew Pub.** The Wheeping Radish Brewery is North Carolina's oldest Micro Brewery. Watch the beers being brewed by tour. If you are located in Corolla but still want to enjoy the variety of beers brewed at the Wheeping Radish, the Corolla Brew Pub also offers these quality beers.

#### Day Three: Fish and Surf

- h) Corolla Bait and Tackle (Corolla)
- i) Corolla Surf Shop (Corolla)

Come and enjoy a day of fishing with friends. Bring your own poles and bait or rent from one of the local bait and tackle shops, such as **Corolla Bait and Tackle**. Surf fishing is a fun and unique form of angling. The **Corolla Surf Shop** also gives you the option of learning how to surf. Summer surf on the Outer Banks, especially in Corolla, creates some of the safest waves for beginning surfers. In fact, Outside Magazine has ranked Corolla as one of the top 6 destinations in the US to learn how to surf! If you already know how to surf, but left your board at home – no problem, you can rent one from this surf shop.
